



## Background


Storm Point wines are from the Swartland, a dry, rugged viticultural area that is known for being the birthplace of South Africa's "new wave" of wine. Indeed, Storm Point is made with these modern-meets-old, stripped-back sensibilities. The three wines in this series ferment with native yeast and modest sulfur, a rarity for wines of this value and volume, in order to let the ruggedness of their origins shine through. This pioneering attitude has always been the ethos of the brand. Storm Point is named for the violent Cabo das Tormentas ("Cape of Storms") that Portuguese explorers experienced sailing around the Horn of Africa on their voyages to India. Legend has it the keeper of the seas, the Adamastor, chose who would pass and who would perish, and he was kinder to those who stated their intentions and waited out the storm. Thus, Storm Point represents the ideal that good things come to those who dream big, plan dutifully, and wait. With their purity and drive, Storm Point is an excellent entry-point into the vast world of South African wine.
