
PHASE THREE


Barossa Valley - Australia



Phase Three is a family winery in the Flaxman Valley, started by Ben and Sabina Kelley during their "third phase" of life after leaving careers in wine retail and the food industry. Seeking a simpler life, they moved to Barossa with their children, dogs, and a bird, initially intending only to plant truffle-inoculated oak trees. However, after a suggestion at a local winery, they ventured into winemaking, sourcing old vine Shiraz and Chardonnay for their first vintage in 2019. The following year, they purchased a historic 38-acre property in Eden Valley, where they planted vineyards, hazelnut groves, and maintained areas for native wildlife and sheep grazing. Their winemaking philosophy emphasizes simplicity, with minimal intervention, whole cluster fermentations, and gravity transfers. Dero, their flagship wine, refers to a social derelict, which is how they felt starting a winery in the Barossa with no family history and no connections. The choice of this name and the unique brown paper bag packaging serve as a guirky reminder of their unconventional journey.







The style of their flagship wine, Dero, is minimal intervention with whole cluster & native yeast fermentation.

This is Phase Three's flagship wine sourced from an allocated Ebenezer plot farmed by Adrian Hoffmann, one of Australia's most lauded viticulturists. The handpicked fruit underwent various fermentations, including whole-cluster carbonic maceration, then aged in French oak for about 1.5 years. It was blended with older Dero and about 10% Pinot Noir before being bottled unfined, unfiltered and with minimal sulfur. It is lush, earthy, and silky.
